


- Our Friday morning breakfast bible study is reviewing "Living a Life That Matters" and is open to any who would be able to attend.

I consider the days of old, the years long ago (Psalms 77:5.

Lately I have been thinking about days of old spent growing up in Franklin, Tennessee which at the time was just a small country town. Downtown Franklin consisted of one rather short main street on which you could find whatever you needed, be it groceries, a restaurant, a drug store, clothes and shoes. Early on Saturday morning farmers from miles around

would descend on this little town spending most of the day visiting with each other, solving problems or playing checkers on the courthouse lawn.

Those were the days when respect for authority, be it in the home or out in society was taught and expected from everyone. They were days when you heard a lot of "yes ma'am", "no ma'am", "yes sir", "no sir" and "thank you". Honesty was expected from young and old alike. A man's word was his bond and a handshake often sealed the deal. Those were days in which sins of the flesh such as drinking, gambling in any form, cursing, adultery, homosexuality and uncleanness of any kind was soundly condemned from the pulpit, the classroom and, yes, even on street corners (Gal. 5:19-21; 1 John 2:15-17). This was known as "hell fire and brimstone" preaching. One day this became labeled "negative preaching" so a shift was made to what many called "positive preaching". Given the wickedness and gross immorality engulfing our society today, it might be a good time to bring back some of that "old fashioned hell fire and brimstone preaching".

In those "days of old", churches were not in a mad rush to attract great crowds and would do whatever it took to bring them in, even if it meant perverting the word of God (Gal. 1:6-9). Even though there has never been a time when everybody trusted and obeyed God, those were days in which God was for the most part in the home, the schools, the courts and even in the halls of government. Ah, "the good old days" when the world did not seem to be as crazy and mixed up as it is today.

Today, we need to meditate on all that God has done, is doing and will do for us if we are faithful and true to him; we need to think about all the works of his hand (Psalms 143:5) and maybe, just maybe, return to some of those things of long ago.
