

RESTORING THE RISK OF SINNING

In 1974, economist Sam Peltzman took note of, what he called, "a feed-back affect" from enhanced auto safety. Drivers wearing safety belts suffered fewer injuries that drivers who did not. But safety-belt-wearing drivers also inflicted more injuries. His conclusion? "The safer drivers felt, the more recklessly they drove." (George Will, "Up From Geniality," Newsweek, 5 September, 1994, 76.)

Theoretically, a prescription for safer drivers would be to reduce auto safety. Take away the safety belt, ABS brakes and the airbag. Restore the risks of driving. You would breed discipline, sobriety and prudence behind the wheel.

A tight rope walker might experience a similar feedback effect from practicing with a safety net. He might have a tendency to become careless and sluggish on the high wire. The safer he feels, the more recklessly he performs. Remove the safety net and restore the risks of falling. He would breed discipline in his high-wire performance.

There is often a temptation to remove the subject of hell from our theology. But hell was a real part of Jesus' "theology."

Hear Jesus: "I tell you, no, but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish" (Luke 13:5). And, "If your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off; it is better for you to enter life lame, that having you two feet, to be cast into hell, where the worm does not die, and the fire is not quenched" (Mark 9:45, 46).

Peter grounded his instructions to Christians, in danger of becoming sluggish, in the fact of the burning day of judgment that is coming. "Since these things are to be destroyed in this way, what sort of people ought you to be in holy conduct and godliness" (2 Pet 3:11).

If we are going to ignore the facts about the day of the Lord in our preaching and teaching, we had better be prepared for a feedback effect. The safer unrepentant sinners feel, the more recklessly they are inclined to live. There is a time to eliminate that safety. Remove the "everything's hunky dory" feelings. Preach judgment and hell. Restore the risk of sinning. The Word will breed discipline, sobriety and prudence. Don't misunderstand me. We need to teach the security of those who are in Christ (I John 5:13). Some who are living scared silly of going to hell need not live that way. There is safety in Jesus.

But if Peter did not deem it inappropriate to remind Christians about the risk of judgment and hell as a motivating tool toward "holy conduct and godliness," then neither should we. And those who are walking the broad way are ignorant of its destination (Matthew 7:13, 14). They have a right to know where that road is going.
